









Education Leadership Institute

In February 2009, a team of experts on arts education gathered to discuss the future of arts education in Utah. The committee looked at a Utah publication from the 1990's called "Keeping the Promise" and examples of strategic plans from other areas of the US, and determined it would be beneficial to update the plan. They met a second time to look at a state map of all art education activities in order to determine where gaps in programming exist. At the meeting they also heard from a local expert on outcomes for arts education.

At the same time Utah Arts Council staff wrote a proposal to the National Endowment for the Arts to participate in the Education Leadership Institute which was accepted. In June 2009, a six member team (Julie Fischer, State Representative, Raymond Tymas-Jones, University of Utah Dean of the College of Fine Arts, Victoria Rowe-Berry, Director of Utah State University's Nora Eccles Harrison Museum, Brenda Hales, Associate Superintendent of Utah State Office of Education, Margaret Hunt, Director of Utah Division of Arts & Museums, and Janet Wolf, Director of Education Initiatives) attended the institute in Chicago, II. The group spent four days in lectures, discussions and a team charrette considering the question, "how does Utah build public will that sustains and increases our capacity to integrate the arts throughout learning?" The team formulated a plan for action in the coming months which includes creating a steering committee, convening a state-wide education leadership institute, and determining ways to better tell the story of all the good work that is already going on in Utah.

Poetry Out Loud

The Poetry Out Loud program in Utah has become an important part of a flourishing literary community. One Utah high school, Judge Memorial in Salt Lake City, has embraced the recitation of poetry in a big way ... to the extent that teachers set a goal this year that each student in all English classes would memorize a poem. Result: approximately 800 Judge Memorial students each memorized a poem in the fall semester of 2008. Also, the school Poetry Out Loud Championship contest is now an all-school assembly (complete with cheering sections). Elsewhere in Utah our state's Poet Laureate, Katharine Coles, has been a big supporter of the program, and has praised Poetry Out Loud in her appearances on television and radio.

The Utah State Poetry Society has also become a big supporter of the program, and has for the past two years, featured a recitation by our state POL champion at their annual spring Poetry Festival in April. We have also included a recitation by our state champion at the Mountain West Conference on the

Arts in Salt Lake City for the past two years. Our state champion's performance at the state finals was the featured video of the month on NowPlayingUtah.com, Utah's premier web site for arts activities.

Poetry has assumed a much more prominent position in the arts scene in Utah and Poetry Out Loud has been a big contributor to this increased visibility.

The Beverley Taylor Sorenson Arts Learning Program

The Beverley Taylor Sorenson Arts Learning Program, a public/private partnership between the Utah State Office of Education, Art Works for Kids, Utah PTA, and the Arts Council began in July 2008 with the hiring of 37 arts specialists for 58 Utah elementary schools, representing 20 school districts. The idea for the program originated between

the Art Works for Kids Foundation and the Arts Council. Art Works for Kids had a 12 year track record of funding arts education in elementary schools **B** and the Utah Arts Council had determined to work for the reintroduction of arts education in Utah's schools after its Listening Tour. Funding for the model arts education program was appropriated by the Utah Legislature.

The purpose of the BTS arts learning program is to integrate arts learning into all school curriculum to enhance learning in all subjects. Each school receiving funding applied to the arts council to hire a

specialist to teach in one of four disciplines: dance, drama, music, or visual art. Selected schools implement the program with the side by side teaching model, which pairs the classroom teacher with the arts specialist weekly, for a cooperative and integrated art lesson.

Funding for professional development and research and evaluation was also provided in order to support on-going skills development for the art specialists, as well as clear measurement of outcomes from the initiative. A small materials budget was also provided to each participating school along with a one to one match offered to school districts employing District Arts Coordinators at the elementary level. The program funds a portion of those positions as well. The Utah State Office of Education administers the fiscal part of the program, the Utah Arts Council administers the rest.

Mountain West Conference on the Arts

The Mountain West Conference on the Arts is a state and region-wide gathering which provides opportunities for innovation, networking and professional development. The conference is designed to help individuals and organizations in the arts community access essential resources and create community connections throughout Utah and the Mountain West. The conference is also part of a long-term effort to sustain the creative industry by providing opportunities, education, tools, information and resources that serve all contributors to the arts.

The 2009 conference took place on one day and had over 400 people in attendance. Highlights of the conference included the following: A Keynote address titled, "Healing and Community Building Through Creative Action" was given by Lily Yeh, artist and social change activist as well as Founder of The Village of Arts and Humanities, and Barefoot Artists Inc.; A Caucus Session titled: Envisioning a Collaborative Future for the Arts and was lead by Richard Sline, Ph.D.; A State of the Nation Address was given by Mario Garcia Durham, Director of Presenting & Artist Communities, National Endowment for the Arts; and the Governor's Leadership in the Arts Awards were presented by the Executive Director of the Dept. of Community and Culture, Palmer DePaulis.

Conference performances took place by the following Utah performing artists and performing arts groups: Lark & Spur, The Red Rock Hot Club, and Janna Tessman the 2009 Utah Poetry Out Loud State Champion.

Sessions were led by experts from within and from outside of Utah. Some of the most highly attended workshops included: *How to Pitch to the Media: Free Press versus a Real Story* presented by Doug Fabrizio, Ellen Fagg, and Jerry Rapier; *The Art of Measuring Performance: A Metrics Primer for the Artistic Mind* presented by Wendi Hassan; and *The New World of the Nonprofit Arts: Adapting to a Shifting Landscape* presented by Anthony Radich.

Museum Interpretation Initiative

As Office of Museum Services staff visited museums throughout Utah, we realized that one of museums' greatest needs was to improve the interpretation of their exhibitions: that is, telling the many stories of their objects and artifacts to their visitors. In order to help meet this need, we joined with the Utah Humanities Council (UHC), The Utah Museum Association (UMA), and The Utah Museum of Fine Arts to begin presenting day-long workshops to train museum staff and volunteers to improve this essential part of their museums.

We held four day-long workshops throughout Utah in Lehi, Myton, Cedar City, and Fairview, drawing participants from 34 Museums. In addition, we offered sessions on Museum Interpretation at the Utah Museum Association Conference, and consulted with and visited many museums to talk about ways they can improve their exhibits by telling their stories more fully.

The workshops are designed to help museum staff and volunteers discover, document, and tell the stories behind the objects in their museums. They cover a range of subjects, including how to research and find information about objects: how to talk to donors and their families, how to collect oral histories, and how to carry out archival and library research. The workshops will also

focus on producing labels that are informative, interesting, attractive, and safe for museum objects. And we train them to give tours of the museum that keep the visitors interested and anxious for more!

In addition to workshops, OMS and the UHC jointly offer grants to small museums so they can carry out interpretive projects. Staff visit the museums as they work on their grants, helping assure that the projects are successful. Grants provide funds to help museum projects such as developing new labels, gathering data from knowledgeable donors and curators, constructing new interpretive exhibits, and developing docent/volunteer training programs.



Change Leader Certification

Started in 2005, the Change Leader program is a multifaceted professional development program that addresses leadership issues in relation to leading change. Change Leaders have played critical roles in the development of such well-known Utah projects as the Utah Pioneer Heritage Arts, the Casino Star Playhouse in Gunnison, and the Utah Arts Festival.

Community & State Partnership Outreach

In FY09, Community and State Partnerships ramped up outreach to Utah community member of all concentration, size, and location. Outreach came in the form of capacity building meetings and grant writing workshops and information distribution tours with arts councils, heritage groups, museums and professional organizations.

Performing artists and presenters were also offered the opportunity to attend workshops tailored to their needs. Throughout the year, workshops such as *WESTAF Tour West Grant: Everything You Need to Know, Maximizing your Presence on the Web*, and *Getting the Most Out of Booking Conferences*, were held, and allowed for face-to-face discussions on funding, organization, and infrastructure needs to take place among members of Utah's performing community.



Free Night of Theater

The Utah Arts Council in partnership with NowPlayingUtah.com brought New York City-based Theatre Communications Group's national Free Night of Theater program to the state of Utah on October 16, 2008.

Six Utah theatres from across the state were involved in the program of making Theatre available and free to first-time attendees as part of this successful national program. Within just *13 minutes* of tickets becoming available 5 of the 6 theatres sold out. Many theatres added more tickets and ultimately over 600 patrons experienced local theatre, most for the first time, for free.

Theatre Communications Group (TCG), the national organization for the not-for-profit American theatre, developed this innovative national audience development initiative to attract new audiences and raise public awareness

about live theatre. The program provides a unique opportunity for theatres nationwide to collaborate on a project that provides access for new audiences to experience the joy of theatre for the first time. Utah participating Theatre included: The Egyptian Theatre Company, the Grand Theatre, Plan-B Theatre Company, Pygmalion Theatre Company, Salt Lake Acting Company, and the Utah Shakespearean Festival.

Traveling Exhibition Program



The Traveling Exhibition Program (TEP) seems to grow in popularity each year as more and more venues hear about the opportunity to bring art to their schools, libraries and community centers. The amount of installations this year increased from 52 to 64. By including more educational materials and other processes online, we were able to increase our efficiency.

In addition to our regular re-curated exhibits (Utah Watercolor Society, All-State High School Exhibit and Hogle Zoo's World of the Wild), TEP was able to add a newly curated exhibit to its schedule this year. The Utah State Fair approached us with an interest in taking the winners of their photography contest on the road. "Prize Photography from the State Fair" traveled to five venues

this year and we plan to re-curate similar exhibits with the Fair in the coming years.

Design Arts Utah 2009

The Design Arts Program is dedicated to the promotion of excellence in the diverse fields of design in Utah. We strive to help the citizens of Utah see, experience, use and value the art of design that surrounds us daily. The Design Arts are defined but not limited to architecture, landscape architecture, community design, environmental design (interior, lighting, etc.) product design (fashion, furniture, transportation, electronics, etc.) and industrial design.

Annually, the Design Arts Program coordinates and sponsors a juried exhibition of Utah designers from a wide variety of fields. In 2009, Mr. Reed Kroloff, Director of the Cranbrook Academy of Art and Art Museum, reviewed the work of twenty-two Utah designer's forty-two projects. Nine projects were selected for inclusion in the annual celebration and promotion of Utah design-

ers. This review and exhibition provides opportunities for Utah's designers to have their work viewed by professionals in the field and to exhibit their work in venues outside the usual for the field of design.

After his review of the Utah applications, Mr. Kroloff said, "There is a real talent pool in the region that deserves recognition. I was particularly interested in the number of product design submissions, as Utah is not necessarily the first state one would think about relative to that field."

Mondays in the Park

This season's eight Mondays in the Park concert featured fourteen groups representing Utah's various cultural communities. The season started with Native American flute music and ended with a combination of Greek dance, Asian Indian dance and Russian vocal music reflecting the variety of worldwide cultural traditions that are now nurtured in our state.

Performers sharing traditional music and dance from their homelands in Asia, the Middle East, Central/South America, and Polynesia shared the stage with old-time Mormon musicians in front of audiences who truly appreciated learning more about their Utah neighbors. Since 1987 the Folk Arts Program has hosted these free concerts of folk music and ethnic in front of the Chase Home Museum of Utah Folk Arts in Liberty Park

Public Art

The Public Art Program commissions artists from Utah and nationwide to create site-specific art in and around the public spaces of State facilities throughout Utah. This art, created by artists in collaboration with the community and the facility for which it is being created, enhances and helps build economically healthy and beautiful communities in Utah. These site-specific artworks, commissioned by the Public Art Program and chosen by the community based selection committees, can take the form of architecturally incorporated elements, landscape design, glass, textile, painting, and/or sculpture.

Statewide Annual Exhibition: Painting & Sculpture

The Statewide Annual competition and exhibition was held in the Rio Gallery in the historic Rio Grande building in Salt Lake City October 17 to November 26, 2008. Two out-of-state jurors selected 44 artists for exhibition of their artwork and selected six to receive cash awards for their submitted work. The six awardees were: Tom Betts, Salt Lake City; Wendy Chidester, Draper; J.R. Gabriel, Salt Lake City; Colin Tuis Nesbit, Spanish Fork; Christopher L. Thornock, Provo; and Cristin E. Zimmer, Salt Lake City.

Juror Barbara Robinson of Boise, Idaho commented, "I was impressed by the quality of the work, how many of the pieces were professionally presented, and that so many Utah artists submitted work . . . the artwork by Utah artists is competitive with any they will find anywhere in this country."



Memorial Exhibit For Tom Mulder



Losing someone is never easy, and cleaning up what they left behind can be a daunting and melancholy task. In the fall of 2008 a group of local artists at Captain Captain Studios began to talk of putting on an exhibition for one of their colleagues, who was dying of colon cancer. They wanted to do something to show their respect for their studio mate, Tom Mulder, and hoped to display his works. Mulder died before the idea could come to fruition. What they hoped to do with his help and assistance, they had to do on their own. After searching a packed artist studio and two storage units with over 500 paintings the artists curated a show and exhibited at the Rio Gallery in January and February of 2009.

The work was displayed in sections: university work, abstract transitioning into figurative, exotic travel, and most recently, his work that resolved into a

minimalist style of brightly colored western landscapes. Mulder's palette and brushes from his studio space at Captain Captain Studios in Salt Lake City were also on display at the Rio Gallery in an exhibit titled "The Conscious Awakening of my Dreams" – a line taken from Mulder's own pen.

The highest honor given to America's folk artists is the National Heritage Fellowship awarded by the National Endowment for the Arts. In the fall of 2008, Salt Lakebased Peruvian retablist Jeronimo Lozano traveled to Washington D.C. to follow in the footsteps of Navajo basket weaver Mary Holiday Black as he received the second fellowship awarded to a Utahn.

Lozano is a native of Huamanga, Ayacucho, Peru, in the Peruvian Andes where he learned the traditional arts of his native region at a young age. As he developed an international reputation for work that sometimes depicted the political situation in Peru, growing terrorism forced him to leave his homeland. In 1996 he made Utah his permanent home. Lozano's work is based on ancient Catholic art forms and he specializes in crucifixes and especially retablos -- a traditional art form that combines sculpture and painting to create miniature scenes depicting everyday life, historical events and religious beliefs. Unlike most retablists, he sculpts figures individually rather than mass-producing them in molds. He mixes the images and symbols of his Peruvian-Catholic heritage with those from his new home in Utah.

Utah Original Writing Competition

The Utah Arts Council's annual Utah Original Writing Competition for FY 2009 saw a major increase in participation from previous years. In 2008 the contest saw 225 manuscripts entered and in 2009 that number jumped to 329, an increase of 46%. Building on a 50-year history of success, this contest has helped to launch the careers of some of Utah's best writers. Past winners include Ron Carlson, David Lee, Pam Houston, and Utah's Poet Laureate, Katharine Coles.

Utah Original Writing Competition (continued)

As Utah's literary community grows in numbers and in talent, the Utah Arts council's Literary Program is growing with it. By increased use of electronic databases, advance emailing technology, and a growing presence on the internet, the Literature Program is reaching out to authors and would-be authors in every corner of Utah.

The Utah Arts Council's annual writing contest gives awards in seven different categories, including: poetry, writing for young readers, fiction and nonfiction. The wide outreach to the state's writers, and the many kinds of writing included in this contest, allows for writers from all parts of the state, nearly every genre and level of experience, to participate. The numbers show that, as more and more of Utah's writers look for opportunities to share their work, the Literature Program, through the annual Original Writing Competition, and other program offerings, are meeting the needs of the writing community.

Governor's Leadership in the Arts

The Governor's Awards in the Arts were established in 1980 to recognize individuals and organizations that make outstanding contributions to cultural life of Utah.
