## 1. What color is used to paint most of the paintings?

Red ochre, sometimes white, green, yellow, blue and black

# 2. What are the rock paintings painted on?

Cliffs, under overhangs, rock walls

## 3. Where are these photographs taken?

Most are in Utah with the exception of #7 in Arizona and # 19 in Nevada.

Sheep, snakes, deer, insects, birds, lizards, etc

Pictographs (painted), petroglyphs (carved)

Prehistoric Native American artists

# 9. When were they created?

The earliest were created around 6750 B.C.

# 10. Why was it important for the photographer, Craig Law, to take all these pictures? Vandalism; gunshots, graffiti, removal or attempted removal, is by far the major threat to Utah's prehistoric rock art and the artist is trying to raise awareness and appreciation so people will not hurt them.

#### 11. What forces of nature are destroying some of these works of art?

Wind and water erosion. Weather conditions destroy the pictures, the artist is trying to preserve them for our history.
