

ARTS EDUCATION PROGRAM Professional Development Sponsorship Guidelines

PURPOSE OF SPONSORSHIP

To promote arts education professional development through events and conferences for educators within schools and community organizations, through direct instruction, implementing arts making with learners.

UTAH ARTS AND MUSEUMS ARTS EDUCATION SPONSORSHIP GOALS

- Promote the value and impact of arts education in schools and communities
- Support professional development for staff and teachers of schools and community organizations
- Provide fair and accessible opportunities
- Serve as a state resource for arts education
- Communicates agency arts education identity
- Optimizes the organization's capacity to fulfill vision for arts education

SPONSORSHIP GUIDELINES

- Must be of value to UA&M and its constituents
- Support is limited to events and conferences providing professional development in arts education for teachers, individuals, community organizational staff and learners under the direction of qualified teaching artists/arts educators.
- Applications should be submitted well in advance of events or conferences *in consultation* with AE staff.
- Instruction must be in alignment with Utah State Fine Arts Core Standards in dance, theatre, music, visual arts, media arts, folk/traditional arts. Cross-disciplinary projects that also support language arts, social studies and STEM are encouraged but not required.
- Educators must be offered recertification points and/or credit for lane change, toward endorsement, etc.
- Sponsorships are generally between \$1,000 and \$10,000 depending on scope
- Payment must be made to an organization with a W9 EIN

CRITERIA

- Assists in reaching UA&M Arts Education goals and completion of annual PD plan
- Assists in promoting UA&M Arts Education values of ensuring all voices are heard, providing fair opportunities across the state, being welcoming to all, and helping our constituents be accessible to people with disabilities.
- Assists in supporting significant and established arts education goals
